Alumnae Biennium (2019-2020) Awards

Congratulations to Chicago Northwest Suburban Alumnae Club on receiving two Honor Roll Awards for the Biennium: Outstanding Communications Honor Roll and Annulet Award for Alumnae Chapters and Clubs Honor Roll.

Fox Valley Alumnae Club received an Honor Roll award for Best Financial Support in the Biennium.

Great job, sisters! We congratulate you on your efforts and awards.

And Now, A Word from Our Treasurer: "Where does the money go?"

How often do you ask that question these days?

First, it makes sense to tell you the source of our club money. In 2019-20, we had 22 members, each paying \$35 in support fees. We also had a highly successful garage sale in 2019, bringing in over \$1400 in gross revenue. Study Nut Bags, our Foundation fundraiser, brought in roughly \$1000 in gross revenue.

That's our income...now for the disbursements. We donated \$1150 to the Alpha Gamma Delta Foundation, mostly earmarked for the DuPage Area Alumnae Club scholarship fund. That included a donation in memory of **Cindy Kopp Wright**, Beta Iota—Eastern Illinois University, a past president of DuPage Alumnae Club who entered Chapter Grand during the year.

Ever mindful of her budget, **Sue Rumsfield Clary**, Beta Omicron – Illinois State University, spent \$149.28 (of the \$150 budgeted!) for pizza, supplies and goodies for the Arbors Homework Club, one of our local philan-thropies.

In support of Alpha Gamma Delta's national philanthropy, Fighting Hunger, we donated \$100 to the Northern Illinois Food Bank (NIFB), as well as donating a brand-new Soda Stream machine to their Women's Board Spring Tea. As a silent auction item, it brought \$220 to their cause. The Soda Stream had been donated to us for the spring garage sale, but it was certainly better served as a fund-raising item for NIFB!

We also spent \$50+ on food for our February program. No…we didn't have a feast, but we did prepare a feast---for the grateful families at the Ronald McDonald House at Central DuPage Hospital.

Beta Omicron chapter at Illinois State University, our adopted chapter, received \$80+ in goodies for the homecoming parade, a donation to the ISU Foundation to honor their Chapter Advisor, and remembrances throughout the year.

Of course, there's also \$250+ in dues/fees to the international fraternity, and various supplies and postage that, just like in your household budget, eat away at our balance. We planned to spend more money, with a stipend for our President **Jean Larum Frisoni**, Beta Delta—Indiana University, to attend International Convention in the Phoenix area this summer, but, alas, the pandemic cancelled those plans. We'll save that Ways & Means fund for the next convention in Louisville!

Philanthropy and Community Service

The pandemic is changing the way we provide Community Service and raise funds for Philanthropy this year. In these challenging times we are aware of guidelines for everyone's health and safety.

Our Garage Sale was a great success. Jody Lanciotti King, Beta lota—Eastern Illinois University, hosted us from August 26th through August 29th. We set up on Wednesday, then held the sale Thursday-Saturday and donated unsold items to Twice Is Nice Resale Shop in Wheaton on Saturday afternoon. Thank you especially to Carmen Muirheid Auerbach, Beta lota—Eastern Illinois University, Bonnie Brown, Beta Xi-Purdue University, Susan Rumsfield Clary, Beta Omicron-Illinois State University, Jean Larum Frisoni, Beta Delta—Indiana University, Jody Lanciotti King, Beta lota—Eastern Illinois University, Gail Valentine, Lambda-Northwestern University, and Kim Woodman Webb, Beta lota—Eastern Illinois University, from Board, and Nanci Gross Gannon, Beta Omicron—Illinois State University, and Allie Stanko Pleiter, Lambda-Northwestern University, from the general membership. How often does the extra work of so few earn so much? In three days of sales in the heat, heat, heat, we provided a safe, distanced way to raise money for Ways & Means. We grossed \$1367.92 with a net profit \$1109.92, as of this newsletter. The Board has the authority to vote to use that money for Ways & Means or allow a transfer to Philanthropy. This will allow us a choice of using some of these funds to support our Jewel status with the Alpha Gamma Delta Foundation or to donate to other, local charities.

We will investigate the possibility of Study Nut bags. Both Beta Omicron-Illinois State University, and Sigma-University of Illinois, are on campus in-person. Both schools are conducting in-person classes and remote learning options. University of Illinois is using the newly approved "rapid saliva test" for Covid-19 checking, leading science and research for the world! Check your e-mail for details on Study Nut bag donations and assembly decisions.

At this time, Briar Glen School students are remote learning, so the Arbors Homework Club is not meeting. There is a plan to return to in-person school late in September or October if possible. The Homework Club may re-start at that time. We are checking on providing hats/mittens to the students in January. Snacks are not needed at this time.


